

## What's happening at the Range.....with Jack Rutz

The year is winding down and there certainly is a chill in the air. This is my third year as Range Director and I am proud to say we have made some great strides this year in improving the range. A big "thank you" to all the volunteers who came out this year and dedicated their time and effort to improving the club.

I would be remiss if I didn't give a very heart felt thank you to Karl Okita who is at the range almost every day fixing, cleaning, cutting, and maintaining the range. Technically, Karl is the assistant range director but I truly believe I am his assistant. ;-). Thank you Karl!

On the less than positive side, we have had a number of troubling issues come up this year with unauthorized gate entry, people shooting arrows

into trees and light poles, shooting broadheads on the practice ranges, leaving messes around the campfire and in the bathroom, graffiti in the bathrooms and on the walkway along with a number of other small matters. To help curtail these irresponsible acts, we have purchased a video surveillance system to monitor various places on the range including the front gate and the practice range. We hope this investment will deter the unwanted behavior or allow us to identify the individuals so we can take appropriate action.

Going forward, some of the trees on the property need attention and may be designated for removal. We are hiring a professional tree cruiser to examine the trees on the property and come up with a recommendation. My guess is a number of diseased trees will be removed from the property when the weather permits. We will keep you informed.

Come spring time, we will hold a couple work parties to do a little spring cleaning and maintenance. The date and time will be posted on the website and we will send out an email notification. Don't forget your good deeds are rewarded by the club. Voluntary work hours can reduce vour annual dues. Check the website for details or contact one of the board members.
