# Just for youth.....with Brandon Tenner

The Youth/JOAD Indoor season finished up at the end March. We had 5 JOAD members that were very busy competing in tournaments around the area. Skylar Atkinson, Ben Kaufman, and Rebecca Bakken Skylar, Ben and Rebecca, competed in their first JOAD Nationals and USA Archery Indoor Nationals and they finished phenomenally. For the JOAD Nationals, (open to kids ages 8 to 19), Ben placed 36th in the Male Cub Recurve Class and Rebecca placed 33rd in the Female Cub Recurve class. Both of these were in the top third of their age group. There was not a barebow category in the JOAD tournament so Skylar chose to compete barebow in the Female Cadet Recurve class against archers with sights and stabilizers. Even with this disadvantage Skylar finished 71st, beating nearly half of her competition.

In the USA Archery Indoor National tournament Skylar chose to compete as an adult so she could shoot in the barebow class and finished 3rd! Rebecca finished 27th in the Female Cub Recurve class and Ben finished 49th in the Male Cub Recurve class.

Ben and Skylar also competed in the NFAA Sectionals held at Archers Afield in early March. Both of them walked

away with 1st place finishes. Ben in the Youth Male Freestyle Limited Recurve class and Skylar in the Young Adult Female Barebow class.

along with Benjamin Rabaud and Matthew Williams competed in the USA Archery 1st Quarter Mail-In at the end of March. This is the first of 4 tournaments throughout the year that clubs from around the US participate in. The first quarter tournament was a 30 arrow indoor Vegas round. At the time this article was written the results hadn't been posted yet but all 5 archers shot very well. During this tournament we introduced the JOAD achievement award system where archers can achieve 9 pins by shooting qualifying scores. All 5 archers achieved their first 2 pins (they shot a 2nd score to achieve the 2nd pin), and Ben, Rebecca and Matthew earned the "6 gold" pin for shooting 6 consecutive arrows in the gold rings.

Coach Matt and I are very proud of all the accomplishments our archers made this indoor season. The hard work and dedication is really paying off. A big thank you goes out to Dana and the staff at Broken Arrow Archery for allowing us to shoot at their range this season.

The outdoor JOAD program starts Sunday, April 13th at the Sylvan Archers range. We will be meeting at 3:30pm every Sunday, (granted there aren't any tournament conflicts), and will shoot until 6pm. If you have questions please contact me at oregonyoutharchery@gmail.com.
