### It's all about Targets!.....



We have a couple of events coming up in January:

#### Traditional Archers New Year's Potluck and Shoot, 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Jan 3, 2015

Sylvan Archers and the Rose City Bowyers are hosting a gathering of traditional wood-bow archers and bowyers to celebrate the new year with a potluck at the Sylvan clubhouse, where you can look forward to Dutch oven cooking. There will be organized shooting on the practice field including wand and aerial targets, weather permitting, and lessons by Laurie Robinson and maybe some of our other instructors if anyone's interested. This is a family-oriented event and those not shooting can bring games and cards to play in the clubhouse. (Dress warm -- there's a woodstove but ... it's January.) Again weather permitting, some folks venture out and shoot the roving range and field course after lunch. Anyone in the community who's interested in wood bows and traditional archery is invited. There should be lots of interesting self-made bows on hand. The event is free but Sylvan will have a donation jar up, and the club charges \$2 to use its equipment during lessons. It's best to preregister for the lessons (robinsnest44@comcast.net). The potluck portion of the event starts around 11:30 a.m., with shooting in the afternoon.

#### Oregon Barebow Challenge, Jan. 24

This may be a first for USA Archery -- they've agreed to sanction a barebow-only indoors tournament at Archers Afield with Sylvan Archers as the sponsoring club. The impetus for organizing the tournament is to provide Oregon archers with a tournament where their results can count toward the World Internet Indoor Barebow Championships (<u>www.barebow.com</u>). Equipment must fit the World Archery/USA Archery rules for that category (string walking allowed; no compounds; the bow has to be able to pass through a roughly 4-inch circle, so no 12-inch stabilizers). Start time is 11:00 AM with equipment inspection starting at 10. Format is 20 ends of 3 arrows each at a 40 cm multi-color target, at 18 meters (which is close to 20 yards). \$20. Preregistration required.
