We will have marked and unmarked 3D courses available to shoot and a 14 target round set up on one of our field courses. We hope to see some of the new members as well as the current members come out and support the open house. Bring your friends and family as it is a family friendly fun weekend and it is FREE!

On another note, if you have been out to the range lately, you may notice our new shed over by the 3D trailers. We needed a place to do repairs on the animals, so one of our members Allen Siler, volunteered to build it for us. We still have to do some finishing touches, but we are already using it to begin repairs on the 3D animals. We are working hard to get the roving course up and ready for the season. We are fixing and replacing all of the animals on the roving course that are in disrepair. Bill Swenson, our director of hunting games, has been busy working on the range as well. So if he has to close down part of the range for repairs or is working out there, please be respectful of his time and stay out of the area if he has it closed down.

We are also making some changes to the 3D pit. Do to the cost of materials and supplies, we can no longer supply animals to the broadhead pit. If you want to shoot in the broadhead pit, you will need to bring your own target. We also ask that you take

your target back with you and recycle it if it is shot up. We have had some problems with the pit looking trashy with old blocks and foam from the animals or blocks, as they are shot up and we do not have the time to be picking up personal trash left there.

We want to thank <u>Cabela's</u> for their continued support of the club as well as <u>Archers Affeld</u> for working with us during the indoor season and supporting our coaching programs like JOAD and for coming out to our open houses. Make sure you thank them when you see them next time!

Flight archery at the May open house

And now for something entirely different: At the Sylvan open house on May 2, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., flight archery enthusiast Alan Case will do a presentation and demo of his sport, which is all about shooting arrows as far as possible in different bow classes. Don't worry, he'll be demonstrating the techniques with flu-flus on our practice range so the arrows won't go into the next county.

Alan, a Sylvan member and automotive design engineer (and aerodynamics specialist) for Daimler, is in his 11th year of flight archery and competes at nationals held at the Bonneville Salt Flats near Wendover, Utah. He is currently developing a bow and arrows to be used later this year for an attempt at breaking Harry Drake's "unbeatable" unlimited foot bow record of 2,028 yards, which has held since 1971.

Flight archery has many equipment type divisions that range from primitive type bows all the way to unlimited categories that take advantage of the latest advances in materials and designs. He is currently working in this unlimited category, while his daughters have gravitated to traditional equipment such as the English longbow.

Alan will bring a range of flight shooting equipment (from primitive to modern) and can discuss the history, rules, strategies, safety and techniques. For those who want to try it, he'll make available a practice flu-flu arrow and flight bow with a set of lightweight limbs and will offer pointers so you can see how much you can improve with a little practice and knowledge.

"Up through the 1960s, flight shoots were commonly held in parallel with a field archery tournaments," Alan says. "Oregon has a rich history of being one of the more active regions at that time. One of my goals is to help bring a little of this tradition back to Oregon by organizing a regular Flight Archery event close to the Portland area. If anyone knows of a large field as a possible location, please let me know!"

Also congratulations to Shanna Schlitz, one of our traditional students working under Laurie. After just one year in the sport, preliminary results show Shanna in 1st place for the national title in women's barebow at the USA Archery Indoor Nationals in Utah this past month.

Laurie also competed in that tournament (in longbow and barebow), as did our other coach Brandon Tenner, who took 15th out of 168 archers, shooting Olympic style recurve. So our coaches have been very busy coaching and competing

as well. We thank them for their time in developing our youth and our new adult archers!
