The Oregon Barebow Challenge

The main range at Archers Afield was packed with 39 barebow recurve archers on Jan. 16 for this second annual tournament, which is sponsored by Sylvan. Good thing there were no stabilizers to maneuver around, because it was tight quarters. Barebow archers, who are so often on the fringe of things, were ecstatic to be shooting a tournament together in such a large group, and the event attracted attention on the online forums Archery Talk and Trade Talk. Nine archers came down from Washington (as far north as Bellingham), one archer flew in from Las Vegas, and Oregonians came from the Medford area, Eugene, Salem and Seaside. Format was FITA (World Archery) indoors, which is the same as two Vegas rounds: 60 arrows on the multicolor target, with a perfect score being 600. Ren Sarns, a legend from Oak Harbor, Wash., took first place with 519, and club members Mike Ellerbe took 2nd with a 501 and Geoff Weinberg with a 499. Shanna Schlitz (444) won for the women, and club members Wendy McKee took second with 424, and Marianne Itkin third with a 421. The tournament is the first and only barebow-only tournament sanctioned by USA Archery. It's a good bet that it was the only tournament in the country where the tournament director's husband (Dave Robinson), made eight dozen chocolate chip cookies for everyone. He lost some of his bonus points, however, when he discovered he had misplaced the box of awards somewhere right before I handed them out. There were several moments of pure panic.

Greetings fellow archers! My name is **Mike McManus** and I have been the Sylvan Archers Website Administrator for the past 14 years.

I am married for 27 years, have two wonderful children, a son and daughter. I have lived in Happy Valley for the past 21 years

I began the sport of archery as a young grade school student through the 4-H program. When I entered my adolescent years the 4-H club dissolved and other interests took the center stage. In April of 1995 my interest in the sport came back and I bought my first compound bow. My initial intentions were to become proficient shooter and use that skill as a hunter. I had been rifle hunting since 1983. After spending hours perfecting the sport I began to enjoy the competitive aspect of 3-D and target tournaments. This led me to shooting in the Oregon Bow Hunters state tournaments. Back when I first started shooting those tournaments, unless you stayed until everyone was done, then the wait for the results to be compiled and finally announced, you would never know how you did until those results were published in the OBH Magazine. Depending on the timing of the tournament and the published magazine, in most cases you would not find out how you did until months after!

About that time the internet was beginning to become a big part of all our lives. OBH had a website but it was not being maintained and was a fraction of the size it is now. I thought, "Why can't those results be posted at the website so we can see the results in days rather than



months after the finish?" So rather than complain, I took action. Up to that point I had no experience in website building but was one of the earlier participants on the internet. I used to dial-up with my old 8084 cpu computer and access a very archaic version of what we all now use for internet. I have always had a love and appreciation for computers dating back to building code on the IBM punch cards in college! I researched and bought website building software and self taught myself the skills need to build one. I approached the OBH board and got myself a job! This eventually led to taking on the Sylvan website.

A few years ago I transitioned from the older website software program to a more modern building tool. This required a few months of self training and learning a new approach (for me anyway) to code for websites. Now the website is built just like the professional builders construct one. It is a combination of HTML (the code language that interfaces with your web browser), CSS (which is the style coding) and various other script codes such as PHP which is used for processing forms. After rebuilding both the OBH and Sylvan websites with new code my next task was to make them format to hand held devices. There are a couple of approaches to doing this and I had to decide on the one I thought would be best for what I wanted to accomplish. Essentially the web content does not change. The CSS code to layout the page is what is added. When the website is accessed from a hand held device such as an iPad or cell phone, that device is recognized and a different code is used to send the page layout. The real complication is that there are so many different hand held device screen sizes, trying to find a format that will please them all is difficult. I actually have three sizes built in; one for the desktop computer, one for an iPad size screen and one for the cell phones.

I am actually quite proud of this. Many professionally built websites still don't format for hand held devices. Their website is just sized down from the same page you look at on your full size desktop, and as you know this makes it hard to read.

I have not shot competitive archery in over 15 years. While it does not seem that long, my time was diverted to raising my children and helping them in the direction of their life's interests. Now that they are young adults I hope to reattach to a sport I have enjoyed so much. I have been able to hunt with a bow over those years, not so much in the past 3. I have been able to help on some fabulous rifle hunts as well as draw some tremendous rifle tags for myself. Like everyone, I keep hoping to draw that great archery tag!

I hope you find the website easy to use and helpful. I often browse other archery related web sites to borrow ideas and improve on the ones I maintain. I still believe that both the OBH and Sylvan websites are among some of the best for archery clubs and related organizations.
