It's all about Targets!.....

Oregon Barebow Challenge, Jan. 21-22, 2017, and a FITA indoors for the future

Sylvan Archers is the host club and Archers Afield is the host venue (thank you, Archers Afield!) for the third year of the Oregon Barebow Challenge, the only USA Archery sanctioned barebow-only event in the country. Go to sylvanarchers.org for more info. This year for the first time, it will be a two-day tournament. If interest continues to be high (last year we sold out the 40 available spots and drew archers from as far away as Las Vegas), we'll explore possibly moving to a larger venue and possibly running the barebow tournament in conjunction with a FITA indoors state championship for all three USA Archery bow classes, perhaps with one day at 18 meters and one day at 25 meters. As far as I know, a FITA indoors state championship would be a first for Oregon. (How nice would it be for Sylvan members to have a state championship in the Portland area?) If this sounds interesting to you, talk to me (Laurie Robinson) -- we'd need a large crew of volunteers to make the larger venue work in 2018 and it's not too early to start planning now.

NFAA field sectionals and state field 2017 at Cascadian Bowmen (west of Eugene)

2017 is Oregon's turn to host NFAA field sectionals. As is becoming more and more common, the hosting state is choosing to hold sectionals concurrently with state field. Our NFAA rep and OBH president, John Wainwright, has requested that we do this as well. Traditionally, Cascadian and Sylvan Archers have alternated in hosting state field, and 2017 is Sylvan's turn, but with the added load of sectionals, we at Sylvan are concerned that we don't have enough parking and camping to host the larger numbers of a combined tournament. Cascadian has graciously agreed to host both for 2017, and the dates they mentioned to me are June 25-26. If you have never shot the course there, it is a beauty, and beautifully maintained -- one of the best in the country.

USA Archery Field Nationals at Darrington, Wash., June 2-4, 2017

Speaking of beautiful courses, USAA field nationals returns to the Northwest for the first time in many years, this time at Darrington. This is a rare and great opportunity to shoot the FITA field format (which follows World Archery rules) while mingling with many of the top archers in the country in a relatively small tournament (probably about 80 to 100 archers). Bow styles are Olympic-style recurve, barebow recurve, and compound, and this year each bow style was roughly equally represented in number of participants. In the spring, I will be offering a clinic at Sylvan in how to shoot a FITA field event, including tips on estimating distances. (The first day of the tournament is unmarked distances, which is easier than you think when you know the tricks.) FITA field is a great format, and the tournament days are not as grueling (for kids and everyone else) as our NFAA state field is. You shoot three arrows at 24 targets each day of the two days; adult distances are 5 to 50 meters for barebow, and 10 to 60 meters for compound and Olympic style recurve.
