Giving back: Volunteers needed for state field and community lessons!

The OBH state field tournament is coming up at Sylvan on June 23-24 and is the largest event that our club hosts, drawing about 100 archers from around the state. One of the requirements in the OBH contract for the event is that the club provide food (for sale) throughout the event, which means we need volunteers to do shifts to take money, dish out food, and maybe flip burgers or brats if we go with those. (I was thinking maybe I would make a bunch of pulled pork in crockpots in advance this time for sandwiches, but if anyone wants to design a menu, let me know.) Ideally shifts would be four hours, morning and late afternoon but if you can only spare two hours, we can use you. And if any Scout troops or other clubs want to sell snacks or baked goods as a fundraiser, please get in touch with me asap. We also need volunteers to help with parking.

Also, Scout leader Tony Mayernik will be leading Sylvan's community lessons this summer and could use some helping hands. You do not need to be certified to be a helper -- helping beginners get set up with Sylvan equipment, offering encouragement and tips and making sure safety rules are being followed are the type of things that are a big help. The students are motivated and often tremendously grateful so it's gratifying for the instructors and a great way to give back to the sport and the club. Dates are posted on the Sylvan website under Instruction, and you can contact me for more info or to sign up to help. The range is open for other shooters during the lessons and we do our best to keep the normal rhythm of the shooting line. Also, the Sylvan board has approved paying for Level 2 certification class for two members who commit to helping with the lessons regularly. Again, contact me if you're interested.

NOTICE OF ANNUAL DUES INCREASE......

The dues for Sylvan Archers has not increased for many years. Costs have gone up, we are in need of new equipment, updates to the roving range and have to pay for part of the new cover for the practice range.

With that being said dues will be increasing on August 1st which is our fiscal year. Everyone who renews on August 1st, 2018 and after will be paying the new rates which are as follows:

Adults: from \$80 to \$100

Juniors and Seniors: from \$50 to \$60

Family: from \$110 to \$130

We are a volunteer ran club, but we still have to pay for maintenance and upkeep and targets etc. If you want to earn points towards a discount on your membership or a free membership, you can always volunteer for the board or for other ongoing club activities. We do not require any work parties as part of our membership and therefore we need to make some changes in our dues structure.
