What's happening at the range with our new cover...

I'm happy to report we had a very successful work party with 16 people showing up to help remove the old concrete in preparation for construction of the shooting line canopy. In about three hours we had all the concrete broken up and stock piled for removal. We were very lucky that volunteer Mike Porter is a skilled equipment operator and drove the bobcat. Special thanks to Verlan LeBaron for renting and picking up the concrete saw and the bobcat that made the work party go so well. Lots and lots of effort was required with sledge hammers due to the dense wire mesh holding the whole thing together. All of the estimated 30,000lbs of concrete was loaded by hand into wheel barrows and moved into the trailer or the stockpile. Thanks to the following volunteers for this awesome effort: Chris Willard, Michael Nakanishi, Mike Ellerbe, Ram Alluri, the Greene family-Kristin, Ken, Josh and Zach, David Hein, Travis Simpson, Pete Collier, Ryan Newton, Alan Siler, and Wendy McKee. Cliff Hoff donated drinks and sandwich makings that were very much appreciated. I hope I have not forgotten anyone. Also thanks to the people that showed up to help but were not able to because we had already finished!

Alan Siler, our contractor and club member, worked with us all morning and donated the use of his dump trailer to dispose of the concrete. He will be working Monday Tuesday and Wednesday to haul away the concrete. He's not sure exactly when he will be there but if anyone is at the club on those mornings please bring work gloves and give him a hand loading the trailer.

Barring unforeseen difficulties the canopy should be framed up by July 22. The club will then be responsible for staining the framing prior to installation of the metal roofing. Concrete pouring is tentatively scheduled for early August.

A temporary shooting line has been marked on the ground ten yards in front of the old shooting line. The range is open for use evenings and weekends from this line. Alan has complete control of the practice range at other times so that he can work safely and efficiently. He may allow shooting while he is working but it must be coordinated with him in person at the range.

NOTICE OF ANNUAL DUES INCREASE......

The dues for Sylvan Archers has not increased for many years. Costs have gone up, we are in need of new equipment, updates to the roving range and have to pay for part of the new cover for the practice range.

With that being said dues will be increasing on August 1st which is our fiscal year. Everyone who renews on August 1st, 2018 and after will be paying the new rates which are as follows:

Adults: from \$80 to \$100 Juniors and Seniors: from \$50 to \$60 Family: from \$110 to \$130

We are a volunteer ran club, but we still have to pay for maintenance and upkeep and targets etc. If you want to earn points towards a discount on your membership or a free membership, you can always volunteer for the board or for other ongoing club activities. We do not require any work parties as part of our membership and therefore we need to make some changes in our dues structure.
