Besides his excellent mentorship and serving as a Trustee, he is also an outstanding cook. He provided many wonderful meals for members and guests. While he was making these meals he visualized what a new club house would mean to the club.

Allen knew he needed to once again serve as President to get the new club house accomplished. The club elected him President and he served from 2004 – 2006. He spearheaded the design and implemented the current club house that we all enjoy. His endless hours of planning and hard work was instrumental to the completion of our current club house. The club needed his leadership several more times. In fact, Allen has been president more years than any other member until his wife said, "You no longer shoot your bow and enough is enough." Allen agreed, but couldn't just leave the friends he has made over the years so he stayed on as a Trustee until June 6, 2019. We appreciate everything Allen has done for the Sylvan Archers and will greatly miss his leadership and wisdom.

# **Sylvan Archer Safety**

First and foremost in addressing our members this month is the subject of safety at Sylvan Archers for all members and their guests.

We have had several reports of broad head use in the past month. Your board is putting out new targets, only to find that they are being destroyed along with the bales due to use of broad heads.



All of our targets, paper and animal, come at a substantial cost to the club, which affects all of us in the dues we pay as members.


Please take this message as seriously as we plan to implement it. "If you or your guest is caught using broad heads on any of our courses, other than when shooting on the broad head range or when you are shooting in the broad head league, your membership will be cancelled, and you will not be allowed on Sylvan Archer (s) property". The following is a reminder of how

our safety rules read as it applies to the use of broad heads at Sylvan Archers.

Broad Heads are not to be carried or shot on any course with the exception that they may be shot on the broad head range, and during the club sponsored broad head league.

Broad heads may NEVER be shot into hay/cedar bales. Remember, you are not permitted to carry broad heads with you at any time, except as noted!!!


This is becoming a very serious matter for our club and its members.
